## January & February

#### Gift Amnesty 2020

At the start of the year,our Constable & Toop funeral home in Belvedere collected unwanted presents including toys, books, DVDs and clothing in support of Greenwich and Bexley Community Hospice. The gifts were reused to raise much needed funds for local hospice care.

#### Letters of Kindness appeal

In July, our Haine & Son funeral home in Hailsham was a collection point for Hailsham Food bank. They were overwhelmed with the donations received from members of the local community.






#### Chase the Miles for Jason

We asked members of the local community to draw a card, letter, picture or poem for us to deliver to residents in local care homes. We are incredibly proud of the responses received: across Sussex, we collected a total of 789 cards, poems and drawings which have been distributed across 21 local care homes; across all Shires funeral homes we received an incredible total of 896 cards: in Brighton we received around 500 cards of kindness; and across Buckinghamshire an immense 3,000 cards of kindness were delivered to local care home residents. That's 5.185 cards in total!



#### **Christmas Toy Appeal**

Across Heritage & Sons, our funeral homes collected toys throughout December for the Christmas toy box appeal. A fantastic total of 4,202 toys was collected by all the donation stations! We could not have achieved this without the wonderful support from our local community.

#### The Salvation Army

We're a busy lot. All our funeral homes across Shires also collected new toys and gifts on behalf of The Salvation Army for local children who might not otherwise receive a Christmas present.



#### Feed Up Warm Up Initiative

Our Shires funeral homes in Baldock and Letchworth teamed up with drop-in charity, Feed Up Warm Up, with a Christmas shoebox appeal to help the homeless during Christmas. The team collected donations such as hats, gloves, scarves, socks, hand and foot warmers.

#### The Need Project

In December, our Shires funeral home in Sandy supported local food bank the Need Project with donations of chocolate selection boxes for children and adults in need as a Christmas treat. The team received 83 selection boxes in total.







## The Field Family Trust

Since 2011, the Field Family Fund has given £98,506 in grants to 31 small charities and community groups, promoting good citizenship among young people in Sussex, providing support and activities for older people and those involved in end-of-life care and bereavement. Here we highlight the impact of two grants made in the last distribution in 2018/19.



#### ENGAge £3,990

ENGAge runs two rural community clubs in East Sussex: TN22 for people over 60 and TN22 Plus for those with dementia, and their carers. Both clubs offer activities, signposting, companionship, support, respite for carers, lunches, outings, film clubs, dancing and lots of fun.

The grant we made supported the work of the volunteer coordinator who oversees volunteer recruitment, retention and training of volunteers for both clubs and the new outreach group, The Travelling Tea Trays, where older people meet in volunteers' homes or local cafés for companionship. Since April 2018, all existing volunteers have been retained and three recruited for the two existing clubs, and a further 11 new volunteers recruited for the Travelling Tea Trays, increasing the total number of volunteers from 35 to 46.

#### Ditch the Slippers £4,000

Ditch the Slippers promotes the health and wellbeing of people mostly aged over 65 years, some of whom have a dementia diagnosis. The group provides three activities per week: Yoga/Extend, Games (mainly skittles and boccia) and Singing. It also affords some respite to family carers while their loved one is looked after.

Our grant of £4,000 helped to cover core costs for the year. "Having activities provided consistently and reliably is hugely important to all our members, but especially to people who have a diagnosis of dementia – and to their carers who can then plan a use for their few hours of respite each week. Based on 2018-19 records, the grant of £4,000 met about half the total annual costs of Ditch the Slippers; and the security of having that money allowed me (the administrator) breathing space to give my time to focus on other things, including other fundraising, promoting the group, networking and liaising with people involved with social prescribing who can refer potential members to our activities." CPJ Field is an active supporter of the Armed Forces community. We are proud recipients of the Silver ERS award from the Ministry of Defence for our support to the Armed Forces community









## Volunteers Day

One of our colleague benefits is to allow everyone one day per guarter to volunteer their time with a charity or community support organisation, during the working week.

Taking advantage of this benefit, colleagues from Rampion House Garage and Brighton funeral homes volunteered at St Peter & St James Hospice in Chailey. The day was spent tidying up the garden for the local residents to enjoy and helping to clear out their stock room. The team have since also donated a much needed hosepipe for use in the garden, and Laura is now volunteering regularly with them.

A few members from the Brighton team volunteered at the Old Boat House Community Centre in Hollingdean. Historically this centre has been widely used by members of the local community – both young and old, but in recent years hasn't been well maintained. Laura Wordsworth, Community Champion for Brighton and some of the FSTM's supporting the Brighton area helped out one afternoon by painting the sports hall.

In his spare time, Andy Holter regularly volunteers with St John's Ambulance.


